# Three New Achievement Certificates Awarded to Gateway Division Members

The Achievement Program is NMRA's way to recognize its members for expanding their modeling scope and improving their modeling skills, and the second quarter of 2022 has been active within the Gateway Division. Glenn Koproske and Dave Ackmann were awarded Certificates for Electrical Engineering, and David Lowell was recognized for his contribution as an Association Official. They will be officially presented their certificates when in-person Divisional meetings resume in September. Additionally, Greg Gramlich has submitted his Statement Of Qualification (SOQ) for Electrical Engineering and his Golden Spike Award, and Dave Ackmann has submitted his SOQ for Association Volunteer; these are currently awaiting final review.

While the "Working Group" for Electrical Engineering wrapped up its work at the end of June, a new group for "Master Builder - Structures" was launched at the beginning of July, with the intent of helping each member to submit their SOQ by the end of March 2023. A working group gives the opportunity for members to support and encourage each other toward achieving a particular AP Certificate within a particular time frame. The Structures certificate is one of the more difficult awards because it requires 12 structures be built, and while some of the structures may be built from craftsman kits and super-detailed, the other six must be scratch-built. At least one structure must be a bridge or trestle. Furthermore, at least 6 of the structures must be contest judged and receive a "Merit Award" of 87.5 out of 125 points (70%). So far, 6 members of the Division have joined the Working Group, and several members' structures will be judged at the National Convention; hopefully even more will be judged in the fall. Projects are scored against a standard, not against other models and modelers, and judging is intended to recognize the good things builders have done and suggest areas where a model can be enhanced even more. Plans are for the Working Group to have a virtual meeting in September where participants will be able to present some of their work for informal comments and suggestions, while sharing techniques and what they have learned. If this sounds of interest to you, there is still time to join the Structures Working Group.

When a member receives an AP Certificate, they agree to help other members in advancing their skills, so don't be afraid to ask for help and advice. # **Richard Lake**

Richard passed away on February 23, 2022 and the following is his remembrance as written by his wife Venita:

Richard Ezra Lake III died on Wednesday, February 23, 2022, at Sunrise Assisted Living on Clayton in St. Louis County. He had been there since October 2020. Members of the Gateway Division, NMRA, may be interested in some of his NMRA activities. Rick and I have been NMRA members since 1993, and probably under a different address for a while after we bought our first basement in 1964. We first learned about the Gateway Division when we attended a regional in Kansas City and someone from St. Louis noticed a St. Louis tee shirt I was wearing. Rick made friends there while explaining that his wife deserved to take the diesel engine cab ride she had won in the drawing instead of giving him the chance because he had worked as fireman, switchman and other jobs at the Kansas City terminal as a young man.

Rick served as division clerk and assistant superintendent in the 1990s but opted not to run for superintendent, as he was retiring from teaching and started working long summers at the Zooline Railroad. He was an engineer and then dispatcher for several years. We regularly operated on layouts of several other Zooline friends. As Gateway prepared for the NMRA national convention in 2001, we had a regular layout construction group that rotated Saturdays starting about 1998. There are signatures and dates somewhere on our 2X4 benchwork, including some members who came to help even though they were well past their own benchwork construction.

Other activities involved working on project railroads, usually 4 by 8 foot portable layouts taken to train shows as demonstrations and to sell raffle tickets. One project designed for and built during the 2001 National Train Show was sold to the highest bidder. Before the convention, Rick dealt with getting structures and track, soliciting manufacturers for donations and recruiting members to build one or more structures. The plan featuring St. Louis was later duplicated for an exhibit at the Missouri History Museum about toys through the ages.

After going to our first NMRA national convention in Atlanta in 1995, we attended every convention but one through 2011 in Sacramento, as well as regionals and operating events like BayRails in California. We assisted with registration at several conventions and Rick gave many clinics. He wrote articles for the Mid-Continent *Caboose Kibitzer* and the *RPO* and earned his Volunteer and Author AP awards. I am currently compiling our Dispatcher AP applications, set aside for several years, and finishing the track diagram. More importantly, I am reviving the long-delayed work on our El Dorado and El Reno Railroad with Rock Island connections. It will be on a layout tour during the NMRA Convention on Monday, August 8, 2022.
